

When Williams was named PD, he left a long run of label and industry jobs - Reviver, Country Aircheck, Southern Ground, RCA Label Group - to reunite with Cumulus EVP/ Content & Audience Brian Philips, with whom he worked as Dir./Promotions and succeeded as PD at KPLX/Dallas. The opportunity to return to programming in a town he's called home for the past 15 years was too good to pass up. "I had been helping out a non-comm in Florida for the past six months – knee-deep in localizing a network-fit station and helping right the ship, so I was already in the trenches enjoying the programming aspect of radio again," says Williams. "My goal here is to create a big sounding radio station with a big station vibe that

Adam Burnes: Game On

Industry pros turning up on television isn't unheard of – see KFRG/Riverside's Ginny Harman as <u>Nurse Leah</u> in 1997's *Invasion* miniseries and KUZZ/Bakersfield's Brent Michaels <u>on</u> <u>25 Words Or Less</u> – but it is rare. So **Country Aircheck** asked Valory rep **Adam Burnes** for the inside scoop from his recent appearance on ABC-TV's *Match Game*, hosted by Alec Baldwin. To avoid spoilers (upcoming!) watch <u>here</u> first.

In a holdover from his days in radio, Burnes still subscribes to various prep services and noticed a Match Game reboot casting call two years ago. "I definitely love game shows," he

says. "I filled out a form, sent in my photo and about a year went by before I heard back." The call with a show producer was far from momentous. "I was boarding a plane, in the middle seat with my headphones in," Burnes explains. "The producer wanted me to do a mock game on the phone, but I was worried about disturbing people sitting near me. By the time the call wrapped, I was convinced I wouldn't get selected since I was so quiet and unexpressive."

Boy, was he wrong. Burnes received another callback followed by a series of Skype interviews and mock games. In June 2019, he flew to New York to tape an episode with a panel of celebrities including James Van Der Beek, Caroline Rhea, Ben Schwartz, Jane Krakowski, Sam Richardson and Vivica A. Fox. (That's right, ladiesof-a-certain-age

why his career path wasn't mentioned in his personal introduction, Burnes shares, "In fairness, of all the things I have in my life that are fun and ridiculous, I guess none is as fun and ridiculous as this beard."

Burnes' trademark look may have been a talisman. After round one, Burnes was down 0-5 in a quest to reach six points. In a show of solidarity, Baldwin and the panel donned their own "beards" heading into the second and final round in support of Burnes, who was deemed both "Father Time" and "Hot Santa" during the game. Burnes and his beard staged an epic 6-0 comeback round to win the game and earn his way into the bonus round. "I felt a vibe with James [Van Der Beek] during the game," Burnes says. "We thought a lot alike, and if there was a guy I was going to hang out with off-set, it would be him. I went with James based on that vibe." He picked his players, made his matches and – spoiler alert! – walked away a grand prize winner with \$25,000. Immediately, he was met in the middle of the stage by Baldwin and the panel, one of which was all too eager to stroke his winning whiskers. (We're looking at you, Ms. Fox.) Less than 24 hours after arriving in the city, he was soon in an Uber bound for the airport.

Sworn to secrecy, Burnes didn't even know when his episode would air. "I told my wife [Tracie] that if I told her what happened, she'd have to hold on to the secret, too, so I didn't tell her, my daughter or anyone at all." When the June 7 air date came around, Burnes gathered family and friends for a socially distant viewing party. "By the end of the first round, everyone was convinced I'd lost," he laughs. "Within minutes of my episode wrapping, [BMLG Pres./CEO] Scott Borchetta sent an all-staff email that just said, 'Adam!' I guess I held up the entertainment portion of the whole thing!"

As for the winnings, Burnes mentioned during the game that he wanted a beach house and his wife wanted a tiny house. "We haven't gotten the check, so there's still a little time to consider how to spend it," he says. His advice for game show aspirants? 

A day in the self-isolated lives of Gone West's Jason Reeves, Nelly Joy, Colbie Caillat and Justin Kawika Young:

JKY: First thing every morning, I sit outside with my dogs and take in the air and trees and just breathe a bit. Then it's coffee for me and breakfast for the dogs. We walk around noon; I work out, and then we walk again before dinner. The in between time is filled with writing, emailing, reading and whatever may be on the agenda for the day — streaming with Gone West, etc.

CC: I decided to quarantine with my best friend Breanna at the beginning of the pandemic. We've been friends since we were 11 years old and have lived in different states for many years now, so we have been making the most of this quality time together! We found a good balance of getting our work done for our individual careers, and we make meals together, create new cocktails and walk three to four miles a day out in the fresh air here in Tennessee.

We have some friends that own a ranch in Tennessee with 30 acres and a bunch of animals and crops. combines the scale of Westwood One programming with the talents of [WKDF APD/middays] Tyler [Reese] and [afternoon host] Kelley [Bradshaw-Brock]. Having this level of talent in this size market makes me confident I'll be able to put it up next to what I was able to do at The Wolf in Dallas."

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The first move under Williams' watch was to finish assembling the newest morning team in town. Known internally as P.K. and P-Dub to avoid the double-Paul confusion, Koffy and Williams knew each other from Dallas. Sadry had worked with Williams on an independent podcast project in 2019. Koffy was already in talks with Cumulus when Williams came aboard, so the next step was to track down the perfect partner, and "P-Dub" immediately reached out to Sadry to test the waters. "Before we knew it, P.K. and I were doing Zoom calls to see if the chemistry was there, and it honestly felt like catching lightning in a bottle," says Sadry. The pair spent time together via calls, texts, emails and Zoom chats, working out bits and creating benchmark. "The quantity of individuals who can mesh with me and my quirky, out-there sense of humor is limited, but Jasmine and I connected right away based on how we show prep, the way we map out our show and the common ground we've found in our humanity, which holds together the chasm of differences that make us each special," says Koffy. And thus, the birth of Morning Koffy.

Q The Mic: Creating and executing a morning show in the middle of a pandemic may not be ideal, but both are already feeling the rhythm. "Even after that first week, the amount of material we had that could go into best-of promos was amazing," says Koffy. "We have enough material to create a Saturday morning best of show, and there are morning teams out there who have been together for five years who can't say that." Each opened up to the audience with personal stories in their first week on-air. Among the more moving segments was Koffy discussing his wife's passing more than two years ago after an extended cancer battle. "I'm drawn to people who are honest and authentic, and that vulnerability was powerful," says Sadry. "If we continue to be that open, there's no limit to the ways we can connect with our audience."

As for the pressure of coming to Nashville – amid a pandemic, no less – and launching a new show with a new PD, excitement far outweighed apprehension. "I know what we'll be able to do, and I know there's not a better program director I'd want to be working for than Paul," says Koffy. Adds Sadry, "I've done mornings for 19 years now, and at the end of the day, if we aren't making a difference in our communities while also entertaining, we aren't doing our jobs. P.K. and I bring those elements to Nashville with our show. And with P-Dub, who is a talent's coach, we have the best champion, cheerleader and mentor we could ask for."

The two are still working long distance – Koffy in Nashville and Sadry in Dallas. "It's been years since I had a cohesive team like this, so I can't say thank you enough to everyone who has worked around furloughs and the issues of the pandemic to get this going," says Sadry. Both are looking forward to finally meeting in person and sharing a studio each morning. "Getting acclimated with the city and the culture here without being able to jump in full-force has been a challenge," says Koffy. "But that has also given us a way to connect. We are living what our listeners are living, and we are there with them through these challenges, because we are trying to navigate the insanity, as well."

Course Collection: Speaking of navigation, Williams added to his new morning direction by steering a rebrand away from "Nash" to "103.3 Country." "I'm a marketer at heart," he says. "That's why I got into radio and why I've gotten out from time to time. Hopefully, I bring a fresh set of ears and eyes [focused on] super serving the people of Tennessee and getting them excited about the music, our personalities, our promotions and the station again."


His perspective was informed by market research. "I listened to 103.3 incessantly for a month, but then I decided to leave the vacuum and start flipping around," says Williams. "I was listening to the Top 40 and AC stations in addition to the Country stations in the market, and there is some phenomenal radio being done here in Nashville. It ignited an even bigger passion in me and a drive to elevate the station and each of our personalities on-air."

With the new name came a logo redesign, an overhaul on all of the on-air imaging pieces and an emphasis on Nashville and its surrounding communities. "It's exciting to be part of a team that demands a larger presence from the audience and does radio the way it used to be done," Koffy says. That includes listener-focused audio, sweepers that call out specific small towns and suburbs outside of Nashville proper and ensuring the branding matches the way listeners categorize the station. "My neighbors never called it Nash FM," says Williams. "Why should we not call ourselves what they call us? We are '103.3 Country,' because that's what we were already being called."

It's too soon to know how these changes will affect ratings, as the most recently released May PPM numbers – April 23-May 30 – do not provide a complete sample of the station in its new iteration. Additionally, both share and cume are still leveling off after the sharp declines during quarantine. But, from April 2020 PPM to May 2020 PPM, the station moved 5.0 (7) to 4.8 (9t) with a cume increase of 17,900 Mon-Sun, 6am-Mid with Persons 6+ (<u>RAT 6/11</u>). This puts Williams, Koffy and Sadry – and the rest of the WKDF crew – in bronze medal position among the Nashville Country stations. All three have their sights set on taking gold in the months to come. Stream WKDF "103.3 Country" <u>here</u>; reach Williams <u>here</u>, Koffy <u>here</u> and Sadry <u>here</u>.

AIRCHECK May 2020 PPM Scoreboard

Country radio shares were up 12.7 points (3.44%) compared to last month. Of the 88 stations listed, 37 saw share increases, 22 decreased and 29 were flat month-to-month. Overall cume was up 3,638,000 (18.07%) compared to last month. The cume leader was **KPLX/Dallas** with 778,400. Mt. Wilson's **KKGO/Los Angeles** was second with 739,000. Versus May 2019 PPMs, radio shares were up 19.6 points (5.41%) yearover-year from last year's 362.2 shares. Cume decreased from 33,902,200 to 23,767,700 (29.89%) year-over-year. Note that May 2020 PPM dates range from April 23-May 20, with the majority of states under coronavirusrelated quarantines and shelter-in-place orders.
