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Holiday Programming: Not Christmas



Scheduling holiday music is a major detour from the familiar, and certainly top of mind with PDs this time of year. But while the Christmas season evolves over several weeks with a vast catalog of familiar artists performing standards from which to draw, one-off holidays require a different strategy.

performing standards from which to draw, one-off holidays require a different strategy. That's because July 4, Memorial Day, Labor Day and Veterans Day have limited and subjective songs from which to chose. We asked PDs to put their Santa hats aside for a minute and tell us how Country radio programs these single-day holidays. What if any music rules are they willing to sacrifice for the sake of embracing the moment for a single, often patriotic, day?

Imaging, rather than song selection was the consensus priority for capturing the spirit and emotion of these holidays. But before you start, says WBEE/Rochester's **Bob Barnett**, "Pay attention to the nuances; match the proper mood and spirit of the moment and make sure imaging is brand targeted and sensitive." Dial Global's VP/ Programming **John Paul** agrees that thoughtful custom production makes the music stand out even more. "The Fourth of July is fun, while Memorial Day and Veterans Day imaging is a little more serious."

In addition to mood, appropriate imaging creates context, says Clear Channel's WDXB/ Birmingham PD **Tom Hanrahan**. "Playing these kinds of songs out of the blue without a proper setup could lead people to think, 'I don't know that or understand why they're playing it' and punch away."

In Memoriam


Country lost a pair of icons in the past 10 days with the passing of former KSON/San Diego owner **Dan McKinnon** and former



CBS/Nashville and Atlantic/Nashville head **Rick Blackburn**. Both were instrumental in this format's rise to prominence in the '70s and '80s, while Blackburn was also a key player in the early '90s musical boom. Many of you may not have had the pleasure of knowing or working with either of these men. But I don't think it ever hurts to take a moment to honor those who laid

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so much of the groundwork that makes Country what it is today. They were both men worth knowing.

McKinnon bought KSON in 1962 and sold it to Jefferson-Pilot in 1984. (J-P later sold it to Lincoln Financial.) The names of people who worked for him reads like a broadcasting Who's-Who. Among them, Don Nelson, Mike Shepard, Lisa Dent, Jack Diamond, Ed Chandler, Rod Hunter, Mike Brady, Mike Stafford and Black River VP/Promotion Bill Macky, who recalls, "I don't think most folks know that Dan brought formatics to the Country format. He replaced the individual jock 'show' with a consistent format of country music 24-hours-a-day. Prior to Dan, Country was programmed in blocks around other music shows. He was a visionary and one of the great owner/operators."

Broadcasting and aviation were McKinnon's passions, and he was chosen by President Reagan to lead the Civil Aeronautics board. He later launched North American Airlines.

McKinnon served on the CMA Board of Directors in the '70s, and was its President in 1977. He crossed paths with Blackburn about that time; Rick ran Monument in Nashville from 1974-76 before moving to CBS/Nashville as VP/Marketing in '76. He rose to VP/GM in 1980. Over the next decade, CBS' Epic and Columbia imprints were home to George Jones, Merle Haggard, Chet Atkins, Rosanne Cash, Exile, Willie Nelson, Rodney Crowell, Vern Gosdin and the Charlie Daniels Band. Following a stint running his own business, Rick returned to the label world in 1989 as VP/Ops of the new Atlantic/Nashville, where he was elevated to President in 1993. He had platinum success with John Michael Montgomery, Tracy Lawrence, Neal McCoy and Confederate Railroad during that time. Blackburn served as both President and Chairman of the CMA, and was one of 11 founding members of Leadership Music.



Blackburn's overachievement began at birth. Born with spina bifida, his parents were told he wouldn't live more than three days. Doctors later said he wouldn't make it a year. His mobility was severely impaired by the congenital disorder, but it never stopped him. Trust me when I tell you he was a helluva tennis player. The first time we hit the court I was rather stunned to hit what I thought was a passing shot, only to find he could play with both hands. He had the biggest damn

grin as the ball shot by me. He was tough and direct; competitive as all hell. He knew what he wanted, and laid it out for you. He and Suzie would have celebrated 30 years of marriage

this month. When he got a kidney disease earlier this year, he made her promise not to tell anyone. He didn't want a funeral



WFRE/Frederick, MD's Jess Wright leans heavily on imaging over music, too, but includes promotion of local community events commemorating the day. Listeners drive the imaging for KCYY/San Antonio's Randy Chase.

Eventually, you have to come up with songs to match your highly focused production pieces. This is where philosophy and individual song selection becomes more subjective.

Paul has "a safe list of about 30-40 songs" for these single holidays. Barnett streamlines his choices even further, for Memorial Day in particular. "We pick what we feel are the top six appropriate songs and play one an hour for a six hour rotation, whether for the day or weekend."

What fits for Labor Day doesn't necessarily equal a Veterans Day or July 4 mood. "It's all about being the soundtrack of the



day," says Barnett. For example, "If you're going to celebrate Valentines Day, be about love! Paul's separation is 90 minutes. "I want to do it enough to have an impact and be noticed, but not take over the station," he explains. KCYY's Chase steers totally clear of one-off

songs on one-off holidays. "We don't play the iffy stiffs. Listeners have so many reasons to tune out, we can't afford to help them go." Ditto KRST/Albuquerque's Eddie Haskell:

"While I might spike something like Aaron Tippin that isn't in regular rotation, I won't stray to the point of playing something totally dated sounding that doesn't fit."

WFRE's Wright says she spices a few songs not in regular rotation, citing "Riding With Private Malone" from David Ball, but adds "we don't add unfamiliar new music just for the occasion."

Paul has a slightly more liberal approach. "I think by making those songs stand out [via imaging], it's OK. I figure if playing a few 'iffy' songs would really hurt me, I probably have more problems with my station than a few songs that typically don't test. I don't play as much patriotic music as I do

Christmas, so I'm not breaking the rules as much with those holidays."

There's another consideration for the oneday patriotic holidays, says Real Local Radio's Bob Moody. "Location. Markets near major military bases, for example, will usually be more aggressive in programming patriotic music, including some iconic songs by artists no longer represented on the standard gold list."

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Adkins' "Arlington," Dierks Bentley's "Home" and Toby Keith's "American Soldier." Aside from music and imaging, O'Brian adds, "If there is an existing event or something else we can do that makes sense, we'll go there, too."

Keith Montgomery

Keith Montgomery is PD at WIBW/Topeka, KS, located near Ft. Riley, a 100,000-acre military installation. "All programmers swallow hard when something is unfamiliar or a departure from norm," he says, echoing our other panelists. "But we do feel

it's very important for us with such a high profile base just west of us." In addition to imaging and a short, safe list of appropriate songs, Montgomery says, "We try to offer real special treatment with free tickets for major events like our Country Stampede in June." He estimates that 'IBW gives away 10,000 tickets to military and their families each year.

There's an increasing challenge to Montgomery's customized approach to recognizing these kinds of holidays, says Moody. "Reliance on syndicated programs and centralized corporate programming limits the ability of many stations to adjust for their individual market." Luckily,

WIBW is a live and local radio station. Many aren't, so Moody advises where there is little or no ability to change the music selection in some dayparts, "Stations can express their patriotism with local imaging and promos for community events."

Barnett and O'Brian remind of us another component useful in positioning any event: social media. "We identify all holidays onair, online and on Facebook," says O'Brian, with Barnett adding "You can immerse your station in each of these holidays to various degrees if you choose, enhancing your halo by maximizing the content on Facebook, Twitter your website and all digital assets."

And Barnett has one final bit of advice for dedicating on-air time to single day holidays: "Either own it or ignore it. Don't dabble. Dabbling is a complete waste of time." -RJ Curtis CAC

November PPM Scoreboard

Although more stations decreased than increased in November, overall shares for Country were up 3.3% compared to October. Of the 73 subscribing stations posting a 1.0 share or higher, 27 increased, 38 decreased and eight were flat.

No stations posted a best-ever PPM share, but two scored double-digit shares: Clear Channel's **WMIL/Milwaukee** had the highest Country share for the month with a 10.4; Entercom's **WPAW/Greensboro** had a 10.1.

Two stations did record their highest-ever PPM monthly cume in November. Clear Channel's **WTQR/Greensboro** had a weekly audience of 369,600, while CBS Radio's **KMLE/Phoenix** added 74,700 persons for a weekly cume of 657,900.
