## **Q&AMS: Blair, Kelly & Chuck** Cumulus' America's Morning Show launched in 2013 on the

company's still-new WNSH (Nash FM)/New York with radio vet Blair Garner at the helm and country artists Terri Clark, Sunny Sweeney, Chuck Wicks and Lee Ann Womack as co-hosts (Breaking News 6/10/13). A lot has changed since.



The show has added 40 U.S. affiliates and the core cast now consists of Garner, Wicks, and as of last week, Country radio pro and former 'NSH middayer Kelly Ford. Country Aircheck caught up with the trio at the company's Nashville broadcast center for their thoughts on the show's evolution and the new direction of Cumulus.

**CA: First, congratulations Blair on** being named to the Country Radio Hall of Fame!

BG: Thank you so much. I honestly don't know what I would be able to say to convey to people the depth of how

appreciative I feel about it. It really does feel like I'm looking at someone else's life. I'm so honored and not sure I'll be able to keep it together at the induction.

#### For many, New York is the pinnacle. How does this compare, Kelly?

**KF:** Being on a national stage with these guys is pretty amazing, so it's New York, plus, plus, plus. New York is amazing and has super passionate Country listeners, who I think have a different passion level than elsewhere because they actively choose Country. And in a lot of ways they have to defend their passion.

#### **Allegiance To The Ag**

It started when the Talk radio syndicator of national agricultural programming launched the app on Triton's platform, offering an aggregate of podcasts. But the app comes with a stream, and DePrez says the decision to program country music was an easy one. "Farmers are very supportive of country music," he says. "They're loyal to it and passionate about it."

He adds that using the stream for self-promotion was also a key part of the choice. "We wanted a stream that would have some stickiness to it," he says. "We wanted to use it as a mechanism to introduce farmers to the available podcasts."

When it comes to deciding *which* music to play, DePrez says he enlisted the help of consultants – who want to remain anonymous – and Farm Journal's database division. "That division has the largest, most comprehensive, most up-to-date and accurate database of farmers in the world," he says. "So we used the database to test the music for our research. That way, we can position this thing as being for farmers, by farmers."

What they came up with is a library of nearly 1,300 songs, and a mix of classic and new music. "If it tests well against a 54-year-old farmer, that's what you're going to hear," says DePrez, pointing to both new and old songs from the likes of Luke Bryan, Kenny Chesney and Jason Aldean as examples. "And given all the controversy, if you listen to The Farm you might be surprised at the number of female artists who test well among 50-year-old men." He says during a typical hour, one out of four or five songs is by a female artist.

In addition to the music, The Farm offers short snippets of farm news, markets and weather, and twice a day airs live versions of Farm Journal Radio talk shows.

Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and TSL has continued to grow since the station's launch, but what generally drives the success of any station is whether it makes money. "That's the million dollar question, isn't it?" laughs DePrez. "Right now, it is not making money. We know we have to get out front and have this digital presence, and we're a patient company. We're committed to this platform, and we know we have to hit a certain milestone before the agricultural advertising community will start investing. That's all part of the master plan. We wouldn't do it if we didn't think it would make money ultimately, but that's going to take some time." He says for now, having that digital presence is just a cost of doing business.

Down the road, the hope is to syndicate the format for terrestrial stations, as nothing like this has been done on a national scale. "We know there are a lot of rural stations in particular that serve a rural community, and they're looking for a unique blend of country music that they already know tests well with that community," he says.

#### MIRCHECK MY TUNES: MUSIC THAT SHAPED MY LIFE



Ryan Kinder

Warner Bros./WEA's **Ryan Kinder** discusses his most influential music: **1. Eric Clapton:** He has his own style of playing and such iconic songs, from rock tunes to soulful ballads. There's something to learn from every song. **2. John Mayer:** I can't remember how old I was but I remember being on a road trip. I woke up to my mom playing *Room* For Squares. I had an "aha" moment hearing "My Stupid Mouth." I immediately

bought the album and learned every single song on it. I attribute John Mayer to inadvertently teaching me how to play guitar – which changed everything.

**3. Keith Urban:** Everything I've learned from him is because he doesn't just play to play. He's actually singing through his guitar. When he hits a note or plays a solo, you *feel* it, just like a heavy lyric or any song that really tears at you.

**4. Jackson Browne:** One of the best songwriters in the world. His Late For The Sky album is one of the first ones I remember hearing when I was young. It blew my mind how deep he could get with something so simple.

**5. Jerry Reed:** He was an incredible guitar player. He challenged me with every song I've tried to learn. I can't hold a candle to anything he did, but he's a player I've tried to pull from.

dream up what this thing might be, the reality of that dream can often be different. One of my favorite songs is Garth Brooks' "The River." "Life is like a river, ever changing as it flows," you know? And you have to "choose to chance the rapids and dare to dance the tide." There's so much truth to that. The show has been like a river in that we started one place and, as the hills and the valleys dictate, the water has changed its flow.

**Chuck Wicks:** I'm more "Friends in Low Places." **BG:** You're the third verse even!

• Highly regarded music you've actually never heard: I haven't listened to much EDM. That's not really my cup of tea. If I'm in the car I'd like to listen to a musician, a player. I want to feel something through the lyrics. I'm not a fan of having a beat kick my head in for three minutes.

• "Important" music you just don't get: For most of my life I never really listened to The Beatles' music. And then I gave it a chance. They're one of the highest-grossing bands of all time for a reason – and I finally got it.

• Albums you listened to incessantly: Jackson Browne's Late For The Sky, John Mayer's Continuum and Marc Broussard's Carencro.

• An obscure or non-country song everyone should listen to right now: Betty Who's "Missing You" from Take Me When You Go. The whole album is hook central.

• Music you'd rather not admit to enjoying: Classical cello. I wish I'd grown up playing the cello. If I'm in a chill mood, I put on some Yo-Yo Ma.

**KF:** The other piece of that is I had the pleasure of doing some fill-in work for them last year and it felt really good.

**BG:** People well above us heard that and were hopeful to bring it on a daily basis. Now that Kelly is here, it's like we're reaching for the brass ring.

**CW:** I've actually known Kelly since 2007 when she did mornings in Denver at KYGO. I knew from that experience that this was going to be a lot of fun and easy fit. She brings a lot to the table that's going to

make Blair and I perform better. How long did you do mornings at KYGO?

**KF:** I don't really like to say ... people can figure out how old I am!

BG: Well you started when you were 12.

**KF:** That's right. Child prodigy.

**CW:** I have the luckiest seat in the house because I have Blair Garner here who's a Hall of Famer and then some. Then there's Kelly, who's done mornings forever. I've done mornings for three years and I have these two amazing teachers.

**KF:** And [Chuck] is killing it, too. A lot of people in his position wouldn't be interested in actually learning the craft of broadcasting, but he's taken an active role to do that. He's grown a lot.

BG: He was three feet tall when he started.

KF: Pretty short.

**BG:** The nice thing, too, is that in very short order Kelly's come in when we're knocking around a topic idea and said, "That's great, but did you think of doing it this way?" And it's like, "Man, that's a totally different take on it!"

**KF:** We're already talking like we've been together 20 years. It was even like that in our very first break.

#### CA: Chuck, having not done day-to-day radio before, how have you changed since the show's launch?

**CW:** I've been in a radio classroom with Blair Monday through Friday for four or five hours a day. You just learn.

**KF:** How has it changed you as an artist? Do you tell other artists like, "No, this is how it really is!"

**CW:** Yes! I'll say, "Boy do you guys have it all wrong! You think you know what matters? It don't matter at all. You think you've got a good song? Who cares?" I still do make records and tour on the weekends, but my priority and focus is here and in doing the best show possible.

BG: And you want this.

**CW:** I do. I absolutely love it because you can't get any closer to the country music fan than this. I know the people who have bought my records or know my music better now than ever before. When I perform in their city I also represent *America's Morning Show*, so the relationship is far more advanced than if they just heard a couple songs a year from me.

**KF:** I love that you get something – and I'm just gonna say it – something I'm not sure corporate management always understands. If anybody gets the audience it's the people in the trenches.

**BG:** Chuck's been pretty fearless, too, in a way I've had to become more aware of with myself. He and now Kelly are so completely themselves.

CA: That can be difficult for people in radio to do.

**BG:** When you're a time and temperature jock always trying to sound bright and happy, it's tough to break that wall down to say, "You know, I've had a tough day. My daughter hates me right

**KF:** Mine does, but she hates everybody right now. She's a senior, so...

#### CA: How much time have you spent with new CEO Mary Berner and what's your impression of where the company is headed?

**BG:** The day that announcement came that she was the new CEO, I feel like the ground shook a little bit for everyone in the company. I was home and probably 25 or 30 minutes after I got **Country Aircheck**'s Breaking News, the phone rang with a New York number I didn't recognize. [I answered] and she said, "Hi my name is Mary Berner. You might have heard of me, I'm the new CEO of Cumulus." What? You're calling me?! She and I shared a half hour on the phone talking about aspirations. I very quickly learned that she is a seasoned leader who appreciates the value of the workforce.

**KF:** She's in the New York office, so I've gotten to see her quite a bit. I love that she's decisive and listens. To what I said earlier about being in the trenches, this is a company that's full of hard-working people that aren't always doing it for the glory or the money; they're doing it because they take pride in it. We all want to win and I feel like she understands that. Change scares a lot of people, but it's usually a fabulous opportunity to grow if you view it that way. *–Russ Penuell*


