Tempo: A Need For Speed?

Part of a PD's job is the relentless pursuit of any competitive advantage, be it blatantly obvious or oh-so-subtle. Speeding up music - sometimes called "pitching music" - by a few

percent falls into the latter category and has been a common tactic through the ages and across formats.

But how commonly is music accelerated at Country radio today? As part of our ongoing series on station imaging and production values, Country Aircheck talked with PDs in large, medium and small markets and found a mixed bag when it comes to speeding up music.

Back in the day, the process was a simple

adjustment to a CD player or, before man stood upright and discovered fire, a turntable setting. The by-product of that speed was a proportionate rise in pitch. Hence "pitching the records." Things are much different in 2012.

"We use something called 'pitchless time compression,' which is embedded in the NexGen system," says WMAD/Madison PD **Mike Ferris**. The pitch of the music isn't altered, but the tempo is faster. As a closet musician, Ferris explains further, "If a living room guitarist was playing along with Luke Bryan, he'd say, 'Oh yeah, I'm in tune with the radio.' Before, when you pitched things up, you literally sped up the record. All of a sudden that song wasn't, say, an E-natural anymore, it was more like an E-sharp."

WMAD bumps its music one percent. "It's hard to notice, but still gives us a little more tempo and a bit more pep," Ferris maintains. He also recalls that back in his Top 40 and Rock days, the practice occasionally escalated. "We did it because our competitor was pitching their music. Soon you'd go back and forth, starting with one percent, then one-and-a-half, then two." (continued on page 11)

Remembering Dave McKee

Randy Owen was the inspiration for Country Cares For St. Jude Kids; Dave McKee was the perspiration. Dave spent 35

years with ALSAC, the fundraising arm of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, and was SVP/COO when he died following a car accident last Friday. He was 66.

"It was one of the saddest phone calls I've ever received," Owen tells Country Aircheck. "He was as close of a friend as I've ever had. The dream of Country

Cares never would have happened without Dave. He was one of the most special men I've ever known because he cared so much about the welfare of children. He was an incredible person and one of my best friends. He will be missed."

I first met Dave in the early spring of 1989. Randy had just delivered a clarion call to action for the kids of St. Jude at CRS that year and had asked a few of us to go to Memphis to brainstorm ways to turn his dream into reality. Now that *Country Cares* has raised more than \$400 million in the last 23 years, few recall that the radiothons were almost over before they got started.

"We made an attempt in the first year, and it failed," McKee told the *Memphis Daily News* in a Feb. 2011 interview. "But it made me all the more determined, and \$400 million later, I was right. And it made me wonder what would've ever happened if I didn't stick to it, believed in it and made it happen."

"It's really fun now to hear the ALSAC board recall their conversations from back then about 'some country music guy who wants to do a radio hook-up,'" Owen told CA in July 2007, shortly after receiving ALSAC's Founder's Award, the organization's highest honor. "'We've never done anything like that. Why do we want to do this?' I remember Dave McKee pleaded for one more chance, and here we are today."






• A song you played or listened to incessantly: Shelly West's "Jose Cuervo."

Two percent would be today's highest threshold, Ferris believes. And to his ear, crosstown Country WWQM also uses the same technology on the same records. "I was recently listening to the same Lady A song on both stations four seconds apart and the pitch was exactly the same."

KSSN/Little Rock PD **Chad Heritage** also uses the NexGen setting and dials music up one percent. "It adds a little brightness to the station," he says. He feels it's subtle enough that nobody notices. "I've never had anybody ever call and ask us if we're speeding up songs."

WKCQ/Saginaw, MI PD **Greg Cole** pitches his music two percent, explaining, "The station does have an energy to it, but we actually made a promotion out of it." Last year, 'KCQ did a songs-per-hour contrast with surrounding stations. "We'd compare our station to another mid-Michigan station, touting our number of songs vs. the other guys." While playing 12 spots per hour, the pitched music allowed for more

songs overall. "It's not like we have to wedge in that much more stuff, but it does allow us an extra tune, giving us 12-13 per hour, whereas my competitor is at 11 or so." But manipulating the music is the icing, not the cake, for 'KCQ, which in certain dayparts appears to be playing more music anyway. "In mornings we're 11-12," he says, "while our competitor is around eight."

Not every song gets pitched up, however. "You have to be careful about some of the more traditional stuff," Cole says. "It can sometimes be different for different genres because of chord structures and harmonies. Country harmonies are such that if you get that pitch wrong, it can be really annoying."

"The biggest reason for doing it is making the other guy sound like they're dragging, or slower," says one medium market PD who asked not to be identified. No longer faced with competition, this programmer doesn't pitch his music at all and wouldn't go back to the practice. "Music is everywhere now; people have it on their phones and iPods, and will notice the difference." he says. "If somebody hears it on the iPod and then the radio, they're going to think something's wrong with the radio, not their CD or iPod."

KFRG/Riverside PD **Lee Douglas** is another non-fan of the tactic. "I haven't done it since my Top 40 days and never found it to make any real difference. While a half-percent is no big deal, anything past one percent is," observes Douglas. "And your best ears in the building can hear the difference." But the biggest reason not to do it is for the ears *outside* the building, he says. "One of the things to always remember when you're programming to women is that they hear the


high end of the mid-range. When you start messing around with the pitch of a song, there could be a result you're not looking for." "I think it would just sound funny," says WUSH/Norfolk PD

Brandon O'Brien. "A lot of our listeners own these albums, but



they still like to hear them on the radio, and I think they can tell the difference." KCYE/Las Vegas PD **Justin Chase** believes the artists might notice, too. "We do a lot of shows in this market with these artists, and I don't want them hearing their music altered on the station," he says. "I just think it's disrespectful."
