### **CRS Opens With Honors**

CRS 2018 kicked off this afternoon with laughs, tears and honors. Sony's Cam led the Opening Ceremonies performing the national anthem alongside the

USMC Color Guard. Nashville Mayor Megan Barry welcomed attendees to Music City, congratulating CRS on the biggest attendance record in 15 years. As



reported in this afternoon's Breaking News, Barry's speech was followed by the announcement of the 2018 Country Radio Hall of Fame inductees, who will be honored this June. Country Radio Hall of Famer and Red Cross volunteer Dan Halyburton was recognized with the Tom Rivers Award for his generous contributions. ## Fall Harvest: Diary PDs See Growth

Nielsen's Fall 2017 diary ratings are out and Country Air**check** is examining some of the book's most notable gains through the lens of happy programmers.

WSLC/Roanoke: Success isn't new to PD/morning host Brett **Sharp** (the station has been No. 1 for 20 consecutive books in

this two-book market), but that doesn't mean he isn't excited about it. The station was up "pretty much across the board in all dayparts and demos," he says, thanks in part to holiday programming. "We Christmas'd it up," he offers. "We didn't play wall to wall Christmas music, but we certainly played more. We aired four to five titles an hour, as opposed to one to two per hour in previous years." Verbiage like "more Christmas music than ever before" was heavily utilized, as adds were presented as

being "unwrapped just in time for Christmas." The station rounded out the effort with Christmas

# A RCHECK MY TUNES: MUSIC THAT SHAPED MY LIFE

WKTI/Milwaukee PD **Ryan Wild** discusses his most influential music:

1) "Record Year," Eric Church: That song quickly became an infectious earworm. I am the guy who finds comfort at all times in music, and truly believes it can be your greatest friend when you need it. This song speaks my love language.

2) "The Way I Tend To Be," Frank

**Turner:** It could be my life story. We are perfectly imperfect, so why try to be perfect? We are all a work in progress.

**3) "The Luckiest," Ben Folds:** My wife and I danced to this at our wedding. It's a constant reminder that love fills in all the holes in your life. We get one life, and when you find love, don't push it away. In today's world, we should be looking for more opportunities to love one another.

**4) Andrew McMahon's The Glass Passenger:** He was told he was going to die from cancer. The album is a deep dive into the battles and, ultimately, the victory. It fuels my passion to never give up, even when the chips might not be in your favor.

**5) Johnny Cash's At Folsom Prison:** Johnny was an icon who marched to his own beat. This is probably the most honest album I have ever heard. It taught me a lot about never being afraid to take a risk, to reach across the divide to connect with everyone. No one is beyond redemption.

• Highly regarded music you've actually never heard:
I love Chris Stapleton, but I haven't dug deep enough into his
library. I plan on taking a deep dive soon. And I just got a taste
of Lindsay Ell's "Criminal." It was my gateway song and I need
to hear more!

• "Important" music you just don't get: Christmas instrumentals drive me insane. Sing the songs! A tuba can't replace an iconic voice.

• An album you listened to incessantly: Coldplay's A Head Full Of Dreams. My wife has to take it out of the CD Player every time she wants to listen something else.

• An obscure or non-country song everyone should listen to right now: Frank Turner's "The Next Storm." I think he writes all of his songs about my life.

• Music you'd rather not admit to enjoying: Can't say I have guilty pleasures. I love listening to everything. Artists and songwriters, keep telling your stories and never be afraid to be real, because this world can use it!



That's not to say Phillips and Lewis didn't bring it. "They really were perfect openers," Callahan says. Phillips, who wears a working-class tough image every bit as well as Lewis or Gilbert, performed first. Then came Lewis, who promptly brought the audience to its feet. "Aaron opened with the 'Pledge of Allegiance,'" Callahan explains. "And it immediately fired the crowd up."

Soon, it was Gilbert's turn. Anticipation hung in the air as fans waited for him to take the stage. "There was a countdown as they did," Callahan recalls. "And when he opened the show with 'My Kinda Party,' they went nuts." Dressed in a black cap, black shirt and black jeans, Gilbert grabbed his trademark brass knuckle-styled microphone and went to work. "Modern Day Prodigal Son," "Country Must Be Country Wide," "My Baby's Guns N' Roses," "Just As I Am," and "Dirt Road Anthem" made the set list, as did an emotional "One Hell Of An Amen." A set of video boards essentially turned the stage into a church pulpit complete with towering stained glass windows as Gilbert used the song to salute the U.S. military and those battling cancer. Gilbert's current single "The Ones That Like Me" proved poignant as well, particularly for Country radio pros in attendance. "You could hear how much that one means to him," Callahan offers. "And before he performed it, he thanked Country radio for always sticking by him."

One of the night's most-talked-about moments came with Gilbert's delivery of "You Don't Know Her Like I Do." "He had a nice slideshow

of photos of him and his wife on the screen throughout the performance," Callahan recalls. "I saw some girls crying because it was so emotional." Truth be told, Gilbert was a bit softer this time around, too. "This was his first show as a dad," Callahan observes, noting that he and wife Amber welcomed their first child in November.

Callahan saw an openness from Gilbert Thursday night she hadn't in the past, something that serves him well, she says. "Fans can easily relate to Brantley because he is so real and has opened up so much about his personal life," she explains. "He's a tough guy who isn't afraid to tell an entire arena how much he loves his wife and his baby boy. And I feel like every guy at the show looks at Brantley like a friend."


The final verdict? "Brantley is a rock star who had the crowd's attention for the entire show," Callahan says. As for future shows, fans can expect at least one more special guest to make appearances – "once he has a crib built for the bus," Callahan teases.

jingles and contesting largely offered Christmas-themed prizes. "Creating the 'Christmas feel' was the goal to keep listeners from leaving us. Our air staff did a fantastic job."

Things were interesting on the morning show, too. "[Co-host] Boomer and I traded up from a fidget spinner to a Ford, then gave it away on the air as part of a four-week morning show bit. We did a different trade at the same time each week-day morning."

The numbers were strong, of course, but Sharp says it's difficult to attribute that success to any one move. "We do so much to build cume and TSL that it's difficult to track," he concludes. "But the numbers were good."

**WOGK/Gainesville:** Fall 2017 saw a return to "norms" for 'OGK, says PD **Mr. Bob**. "The past two surveys were soft for the market toward Country," he explains. "We've enjoyed being No. 1 Persons 25-54 and P18-49 and a powerhouse in the market since March 1994,



but with heritage comes reinvention. We're constantly beating ourselves up in good books and even the ones where Nielsen doesn't get it right!"

The station's "Cash Cow" money contest returned, but with a twist. "For the first time ever we did [it] strictly through text," Mr. Bob notes, explaining that listeners were prompted to text in a code word to qualify and potentially win.

Other promotional highlights included a flyaway to see George Strait in Las Vegas and ongoing weekly lunch delivery from Mr. Bob's Morning Show Road Show.

All told, "There was significant growth in weekly TSL," Mr. Bob summarizes. "It's all about live and local, music testing and a regular presence on the streets. It's doing what the national shows can't or won't."

**KXKT/Omaha:** PD **Hoss Michaels** is celebrating strides among Persons 25-54 and P18-34. "In both mornings and middays," he explains. "We were up by a couple of shares year-over-year for both dayparts." To some degree, Michaels says the jumps can be attributed to iHeartRadio's quarterly contesting and local cash contesting that targeted at-work listening.



A focus on mornings and music helped, too. "Our morning show with Steve & Gina went out several times each week reading to children as part of our KAT 103.7 Book Tour," he says. "And they regularly surprised listeners at their workplaces who were playing our local cash contest." As for the playlist, "Playing the best music meant moving a bit slower [on adds and category moves]," Michaels says. "But when songs like Brothers Osborne's 'It Ain't My Fault' and Dawson's 'All On Me' started showing signs of strength in our local research, we took advantage of them."

Other efforts include concert-oriented promotions around Tim McGraw and Faith Hill, Thomas Rhett, Chris Stapleton and even an "eat and greet" with Old Dominion. The station also mounted a fundraising effort that raised more than \$1 million to help feed local disadvantaged children.

**KFGE/Lincoln, NE's Steve Albertsen:** "Froggy 98 saw nice growth Persons 25-54, particularly in middays and



afternoons," notes OM **Steve Albertsen**. "And mornings saw us climb to No. 1 M25-54, which is a place normally occupied by Classic Rock or News/Talk formats. We've always been strong in P18-49, but occupying the No. 1 position in the market P25-54 tells us our music, promotions and personalities are resonating."

The station benefited in part by new talent additions, Albertsen says. "I think we've

hit some hot-button topics, particularly with the *Gary & Nelson* morning show," he explains. "And you always wonder how listeners will respond to new members of the on-air team, but reaction has been nothing but positive to the additions of Kyle Matthews in middays and Casey Dickerson in afternoons."

Marquee names drove fall promotions. "Things lined up in a pretty powerful way with the Garth experience rolling into town at the beginning of the book," Albertsen says. "We segued from that

into our 'Crash Cancun with Luke Bryan' promotion, and rolled from that right into our CMA Awards trip giveaway."

**KZKX/Lincoln, NE:** There was plenty of growth to go around in Lincoln, according to crosstown KZKX OM **Rob Kelley**. "KZKX has seen five books of share growth with Women 18-34 and W18-49 at the expense of our competitor," he says. "Adult numbers P18-34 and P18-49 are up as well. Add in a couple of books [of] winning Country 'at work' listening [M-F 6am-

Kelley made a handful of tactical tweaks during the book. "We adopted a '12-in-a-row' quantity position, which equates to about one normal-size stopset per hour outside of morning drive," he explains. "The morning show was upgraded two years ago when we brought in 'Super Mom' Lauren, a feisty former local television anchor, and 'Husker' Nick from our sister Sports station. The resulting JP & Lauren with

7pm P12+] and we're happy with the trend."



Husker Nick is now the No. 1 Country morning show P12+ two books running. I am also fortunate to have a full staff of wonderful and aggressive millennial professionals in Nielsen's second-youngest average-age market hittin' the streets. There is rarely an event we don't attend together!"

"It's a Country radio dog fight every day here," Kelley argues. "The market presents a constantly changing audience with the University of Nebraska bringing in new students yearly, and the 'Silicon Prairie' bringing in new and young professionals, so heritage status means less every year. We just strive to provide fun, entertaining programming that listeners enjoy."

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
