#### CRS Research: Another Look

Edison Media Research President Larry Rosin began his 2013 presentation by pointing out that although radio has

employed research for nearly 40 years now, "We have concentrated largely on the hard facts of research, and the easily quantifiable." He went on to explain how this year's study utilized ethnography, the process of observing people where they live and in natural conditions. Country Aircheck's seminar coverage extends this week with an in-depth look at Edison's findings.



The objective was to "understand the emotions underneath our work and the real connections people have to Country music and Country radio." What followed was not the usual PowerPoint barrage of charts and graphs, but a series of video clips featuring 20 Country radio P1s who agreed to let cameras roll during their dayto-day routine. Presented by Edison's Mgr./Research Megan Lazovick and Lori Hamilton of Prosperity Productions, the clips vividly demonstrated those bonds.

**The Listeners:** The audience met Terri, whose home features a radio in every room and who said, "They really do need those radio personalities on the air, because you feel there's somebody that's attached to it." Erica from Aurora, CO said, "The one [radio station] I can relate to the most is KYGO. That's kind of what I grew up listening to ... and that's the first one I go to." Jason is a 30-year old who uses his phone to listen while at work and had downloaded an app specifically to listen to his favorite station.

Hamilton observed that Jason, Erica and Terri didn't talk much about a ritual of turning on the radio "because Country is always on. This is significant and points to how Country is different than other kinds of music in a fundamental way."

Radio was seen as a constant companion that travels with the participants – specifically in the car – and demonstrates what Hamilton called "a personification of Country ... it's there for them in all the important moments." As the videos went on to show, these moments were often emotional ones.





in all of it, including the music for Bobby Bones, After Midnite, Big D & Bubba, and the Crook & Chase countdown. Those are all such huge shows, though; it takes a village. There are so many great people in our company with knowledge of the music, it will really be team decisions when it comes to that.

#### At the press conference for Bobby Bones, we met at least four executives who are involved in the show somehow. Where do you fit into that mix?

Well, you're right, there are a lot of people involved and they're all important. The way I see it, every [local] PD who runs this show has a dog in this fight, too. I have the advantage to be able to leverage some of the best and brightest in this business to get input on this show. I get to kind of be the nexus of this great input; everything we do at Premiere has that team approach. My priority is making sure all the talent has the tools they need to do the best show they can.

#### How is the feedback so far with Bobby after the first weeks of being national?

It's going great so far. Bobby and his crew are a little bit different, and that's what makes the show special. They really connect with listeners and it's because they're real. The chemistry is amazing and you want to be a part of it. I think the affiliates are really feeling that.

#### Are Big D & Bubba still in the long-term plan for Premiere?


Absolutely. With them it's about growth and looking for great options. They are two of my favorite guys and they have a great show. Our goal is to provide a wide variety of compelling and relevant programs across multiple formats. We plan for these to co-exist in the Country format; if you look at other formats there are a ton of other options out there.

#### What about this job appeals to you most?

Having been one of the guys who have taken Premiere programming on a radio level in the past, it's amazing to be on the other side and see things from this angle. I enjoy being able to understand the PDs I'm working with and the opportunity to talk to them. It's cool to be a part of shaping the future of some of this stuff.

Take Blair Garner, for example. He celebrates the 20th anniversary of After Midnite this year and I've never met someone who remains so excited about radio. He has so much passion for the business, the show and his brand. And I would say the same about all these people. They're all unique personalities and they're so real. My top priority with any show I've worked with is to be real. People see though it if you're not.

#### Club Shows: Blake & Kenny



Blair Garner discusses his most influential artists, songs, albums and concerts:

1. Patty Loveless/How Can I Help You Say Goodbye: The most difficult moment of my life was flying home to Amarillo the morning my father called to tell me my mother (and best friend) died the night before. During that flight, I kept hearing Patty's words play in my mind over and over again. I honestly felt it was as if my mom was

reaching out during my life's darkest hour. I thank Patty for that song and all it did for me. Music truly heals.

- 2. John Anderson/I Wish I Could Have Been There: The first time I heard this was on KZLA/Los Angeles. I was pulling into a parking space, and as I listened to the words of that song, I cried. I promised myself then and there, that if I were fortunate enough to ever become a father, I would always be a "present" father there for the big things and the small things. My twins are nine now. I hope they'll understand their dad did his best to live up to that promise.
- 3. **The Beatles/Something:** One of the most incredible songs ever written. It's a love song that gets its point across so clearly, yet never uses the word "love" in the lyrics. Pretty amazing when you think about it.
- 4. **Reba McEntire:** She's the benchmark. I've never known anyone who handles life with such grace and dignity. She's exactly who you would want her to be. 

became "part of my healing process ... different songs help you realize you're not the only one going through that."

Lazovick, who was present at these video sessions, admitted to the CRS audience, "These people told stories I wasn't quite prepared for." Added Hamilton, "This is one of the reasons for doing this kind of research; would you see that in a focus group? Probably not."



Hamilton went on to say that the video clips demonstrated that "country is like that great friend who is always there for you." But while that lifelong relationship with country was once 100% radio, she added, "We're seeing that changing. If you're in the radio industry, think about what you would do if you were a friend, offering this level of support and how that could apply to deepening the relationship with Country radio."

Rosin returned to the podium for his conclusions, echoing Hamilton's point that radio's relationship with listeners is evolving. When people were asked about radio, says Rosin, "They talked about their cars ... the time has come to discuss the fact that we have a hardware problem in people's homes. People simply don't have a lot of radios in their homes anymore and acquiring them is a low priority." Instead, TV, the Internet and cellphones are the priority.

Rosin suggested that like other countries, America should try to offer local radio to local cable systems, to listen on TV sets. Why? "Because despite cable country music video channels, services like Pandora and Spotify, iPods or anything else, Country radio\_remains the closest relationship they have with the music. Only we can screw this relationship up by

failing to be delivered on the devices they want to consume audio on."

**Competitive Cluster:** Rosin asked the audience to think not only how their station competes with other Country stations in town, "but with all the ways one can consume media today. Because

that's the nature of your competition today, especially in people's homes."

Another takeaway from the study, said Rosin, "Is that we don't even appreciate the relationship we have with our listeners. Everyone connecting these people to emotions displayed on the videos needs to understand, develop and nurture these




relationships." Listeners are not customers, he reminded. "They are your friends ... think about how you talk to listeners." He then gave examples of how radio stations sell themselves using "bland, emotion-free slogans" such as "New Country," "The Country Leader" and "Today's Country and the Legends."

An exception he noted was Cumulus' recently launched **WNSH (Nash-FM)/New York**, which is using "Country For Life." Observed Rosin, "I'm not even sure what that means, but at least it's different and playing on another level."

He then challenged attendees to, "Go back to your markets and think about the relationship your station has to your listeners. They want to love you and in many cases they still do love you. But I really think if you said: 'These people are not just people whose ears we rent to sell stuff to – these people are our *friends*' – you would reassess many of the actions you take." 
