New England's New Battle

Early last month, Clear Channel flipped Rhythmic Top 40 WEDX/Boston to Country as "Boston's New Country 101.7 The Bull" (CAT 6/13), bringing an end to the almost 20-year standalone Country era ruled by Greater Media's WKLB. The new station's call letters have also been dropped in favor of WBWL, and following a commercial-free summer, Premiere's The Bobby Bones Show will be added in mornings. Local talent is expected to follow in other dayparts.

To better understand the competitive landscape of the market and how the two stations are positioning themselves against one another, Country Aircheck examined the metro, its Country-

friendly characteristics and each station's playlist. We also spoke to longtime 'KLB PD Mike Brophey and Clear Channel EVP/GM National Programming Platforms and Country Brand Mgr. Clay Hunnicutt.

"There are seven major counties in the metro," explains Brophey. "Middlesex is the largest with 1.3 million people 6+, and about 660,000 Persons 25-54. That's followed by Essex, Norfolk, Suffolk, Plymouth, Hillsborough Remainder and Worcester B split." "Hillsborough Remainder" is just across the state line to the north in New Hampshire, and represents the portion of Hillsborough "Worcester B split" is used to describe the northern third of Worcester County that is part of the Boston metro. On the whole, the 6+

County included in the Boston metro. Similarly, metro count tops 4,088,500.

There are some pretty big differences in signal size between the two stations. (See coverage map on page xx.) WBWL is a 1,700W Class A, and

WKLB is a 14kW Class B. WKLB's local-strength signal covers Middlesex, Norfolk, Suffolk, the northern half of Plymouth, just over half of Essex, the eastern part of Worcester B Split and the very southernmost part (continued on page 5)

Severson Is A 'Bad' Man

Radio and record pros have noticed that promotion vet Mike Severson appears in the Carrie Underwood and Miranda Lambert video for "Somethin' Bad," and even gets a pretty good bit of screen time. Country Aircheck caught up with Severson - who was in Italy (so Hollywood!) - to ask him about the experience. (Watch the video here.)

CA: Did you audition? How'd you get the part? MS: The talent agency alerted me to the prospect and interest. I sent in a few recent head shots as opposed to a formal audition. They had more of a look in mind than acting ability. (Lucky for me!)

What was the shoot like? How long were you there? Like a typical shoot it was show up and wait. I was on set for about six hours, which is actually a lot less than most music



videos. Our segment took only an hour to an hour-anda-half to shoot. We had the scene rehearsed and ready to go when Carrie and Miranda came in. Then it was just a matter of playing our game and listening to the director's cues. It was a very smooth and easy shoot.

Did you actually play poker? Who were the other players? We rehearsed a few rounds

before the shot with the cards stacked for desired outcome

in the video. So, yes and no. The other guys were also other actors or friends of the crew.

What kind of interaction did you have with Miranda or Carrie?

We talked quite a bit between takes. Mostly about Oklahoma since all three of us are from there.

Did you get to keep a poker chip or something? I wanted to keep the tux, but it was a rental. What do you think of the video?

Like the song, it's fun. It was essentially as described during our shoot, but I had no idea how much I'd be on camera. I was glad to have worked with Trey Fanjoy, who is a superb director.

Any other thoughts?

I was not expecting that much camera time. They didn't give any of the guys makeup. We just showed up and went on set as-





of Hillsborough Remainder. WBWL covers roughly a third of Middlesex and Norfolk, all of Suffolk and a little less than a third of Essex.

Part of the reason WBWL's smaller signal doesn't bother Hunnicutt is because it may not be so small for long. "It's hitting a lot of key zips in key areas where country fans live, and we hope to expand that in the future," he explains. "And it speaks to being able to service listeners on iHeartRadio. The station is fully available there, regardless of the signal. So people who listen at work and find the reception getting scratchy on their drive home can connect through the app."

And why Boston for Clear Channel's new Country launch? "It's a combination of things – having the signal, there only being one Country station until now and the success of country music in the market," Hunnicutt continues. "Lots of people write the Northeast off as not being country, but Boston has historically been robust in ticket and album sales and ratings."

As expected, there are some pretty big musical differences between the two stations. A recent seven-day Mediabase analysis shows WKLB's playlist as 39% current, 28% recurrent and 33% gold. WBWL, meanwhile, comes in at 40/45/15. Songs on WKLB were from 2010 on average during the audit period, while WBWL's were two years newer on average. WKLB was the unique title leader as well, with 363 to WBWL's 117.

A closer look at each station's current/recurrent/gold makeup shows WKLB playing 28 currents 10 or more times per week to WBWL's 27. WKLB's heavy currents play 58-60 times per week, while WBWL's play in the 88-90 range. As for recurrents, WKLB plays 50

There have been a few highlights over the last year. I won't lie, it was pretty cool to have a movie air on Hallmark this past December, Finding Christmas. I'd been trying to get my music into the New York Times for quite a few years, so to have them all of a sudden write a great review

of the movie and the job I did in it kind of made me go, "What?!" I studied some theater in college and never really did anything with it because I was always on the road playing clubs around Texas. Pops was actually a music major and went to Juilliard. He was always saying, "Don't be a music major. Just enjoy the music!" Then I started theater and television and he was like, "Wait! That's not what I mean." But I enjoyed it. There's a performance aspect to acting where you kind of get to that same consciousness as you would if you were onstage performing your own music for a crowd.

I've spent quite a bit of the last year in the studio and I've approached this second record a lot differently than the first. I've worked with several producers including Kevin Griffin from Better Than Ezra, who I wrote the single "Already High" with. I kind of A&R'd my own project this time and, while I was in the studio, I was also out on the road just building a foundation. It's fun to go back to some of the places that you played a year prior and see 300-400 more people than there were the last time.

My favorite road companions are Jim Beam or Jack Daniel's. They're my favorite and least favorite.

If I could have dinner with anyone alive or dead, I'd pick both Matthew McConaughey and Elvis Presley. McConaughey's from Texas and seems like a fun guy you could party with. Musically, Elvis and I are very different in our approaches, but I've always been very inspired and influenced by him – the way he sang and performed his songs and what he put into them. That's definitely something I've tried to put into my own music and performance.

If I had to be stuck anywhere other than home, it would be New Orleans. I love that town. I'm just drawn to that city, and really that state. I love the food first and foremost, and I love the atmosphere, the energy and that Southern charm.







Valory rep **Shari Roth** discusses a restaurant she goes out of her way to visit. The Place: Vaccaro's Trattoria in Akron.

The Appeal: "It is one of the best Italian restaurants I've ever eaten at, and that says a lot coming from New Jersey and New York. Their menu changes with the seasons because they use only local seasonal produce. Their salads are amazing and



they are known for their delicious pizza. But what I always get is the make-your-own pasta where you get your choice of pasta, sauce, veggies and meat. Delish!

"WQMX PD Sue Wilson and I have gone there so many times I can't count anymore, so I always try to schedule a visit around a dinner there if I can. Sue and I are always working up a plan to go there when I'm in town. I took the Eli Young Band there with Sue and [MD] Jody Wheatley a couple years back and it was just a fun party. Lots of yummy food and wine a-flowing! The guys brought up that dinner many times after that because the food was so good!"

Counterpoint: Sue Wilson is on board with Roth's pick. "I take many reps to Vaccaro's for a number of reasons and I get rave reviews from all of them," she says. "First, as Shari said, it is excellent. I love to find and support those locally owned places with a rich heritage. When I was growing up, Raphael Vaccaro's dad had several pizza shops in the area. They were



'off-the-boat Italian' and his mom and dad always made their own sauces and pastas. When Raphael went into the food business, he kept his family's original recipes and his mom's original sauce ... but added way more, and went into upscale dining. So while you can get a good pizza, you can also get a gourmet specialty pizza cooked in a brick oven, and every pasta and sauce imaginable, as well as creative seafood,

of them five or more times a week, while WBWL has 46 at that criteria. WKLB's gold library has 97 titles that play three or more times per week, and WBWL's gold list has 24 at that level. Only half of WKLB's top 10 most-played artists are also in WBWL's top ten. Those five are Blake Shelton, Luke Bryan, Jason Aldean, Jake Owen and Lady Antebellum.

As for the music differences WBWL offers, Hunnicutt says, "We want to be where the format is, and that's aggressive, entertaining and energetic. Those are the keys, and we want there to be a fun attitude about it in giving people an alternate choice. WKLB is a very good station, but Clear Channel is very dedicated to the format. Country is the largest in the company by number of stations and we're always looking for opportunities to launch new brands."

A new staff comes with a new station, too - eventually. Bobby Bones is expected to debut in the next month or so. "We don't want to rush it," says Hunnicutt. "Bobby was the obvious choice for mornings with his proven success." As for programming, "Dylan Sprague is currently the VP/Programming for the market and acting PD, working with me and several others," Hunnicutt continues. "We will eventually be looking for a PD, but there's no set timetable."

WKLB's Brophey welcomes another era of having more than one Country station in the market, though things will be different this time around. "Competition is healthy and exciting and good for the soul," he says. "Frankly it is one of the reasons many of us are attracted to radio. Before I came to Boston in 1996, there was a pretty decent amount of time with two stations - what was then WCBS and WKLB. I was able to watch that from afar and knew most of the players on both stations, so I knew how the market was responding. But that was 20 years ago and our format had a very different persona." Regarding his station's strengths in the new landscape, "WKLB has been consistent in focus for nearly 20 years," Brophey explains. "And to that end [it's] a heritage station that is known and enjoyed by close to a million fans."

Finally, if there's any suspicion that Clear Channel launched WBWL to just better its other station's positions in the market (they also own HipHop WJMN, Top 40 WXKS, Business News WXKS-AM and Spanish WKOX-AM), Hunnicutt says not guite. "We look at each station as its own entity," he says. "Obviously you have to look at the market offensively and defensively, but the main thing is to make the station successful. If we do that, either by pulling from WKLB or growing the Country share, either way it helps the cluster. This station will stand on its own two feet. We have the resources to support it and certainly will be using those as we go forward."
