Exactly two-thirds of the way into the chart year (Nov. 12, 2017 to Nov. 10, 2018), airplay leaders in song, artist and label chart share categories are solidifying. While likely to change by year end (see 2017's final breakdown here), the stories of 2018 are

beginning to emerge from data provided, as always, by our friends at Mediabase 24/7.

Valory's **Thomas Rhett** is the most-heard artist at Country radio, at least in terms of current airplay (titles that start the year as recurrent or gold are not included). Rhett's airplay is driven largely by "Marry Me" and "Unforgettable," which check in at Nos. 7 and 17, respectively, on the Top Songs list. Rounding out the top five are Luke Bryan, Blake Shelton, Kenny Chesney and Brett **Young**. (See the full top 10 on page 8)

The top 10 most-heard artists in 2018 so far are all male, with Florida Georgia Line and **Old Dominion** interspersed. The most-heard female is **Bebe Rexha** at No. 16, followed by Kelsea Ballerini at No. 19. The top new artist is Jordan Davis at No. 7 overall.

Speaking of Davis, his debut No. 1 "Singles You Up" is the top song of the year to this point. Kane Brown's "Heaven," Young's "Like I Loved You," Bryan's "Most People Are Good" and Russell Dickerson's "Yours" complete the top five. See the top 20 songs below.

And finally, the one the label teams are holding their breath for – chart share. No surprise, Capitol is

the pinnacle if the lead holds. Offering hope for those who would unseat them is the fact that Capitol's three-point margin is smaller (less huge?) than has been the case in recent years. So, there's that. Onward! (continued on page 8)

UnderstandingMGM'sLegalStrategy

"MGM Sues Las Vegas Shooting Victims" was one of many headlines that had victim attorneys and national media outlets crying foul last week. Beyond the click-bait phrasing, however, is

what is likely to be a precedent-setting case with implications for entertainment, sporting and other events. The crux of the matter is a 2002 law enacted by Congress to encourage the "development and deployment of anti-terrorism technologies."

First and foremost, the action is not seeking damages from Route 91 victims. "They're not looking for victims to pay anything," says Washington, D.C.-based

attorney Dismas Locaria. "MGM is taking what I would call an aggressive approach to obtain benefits under the SAFETY Act."



MGM filed suit in eight federal district courts – Nevada, California, Texas and Arizona, among others – naming as defendants hundreds if not thousands of Route 91 attendees who have previously indicated intent to sue MGM in their respective state courts (see the Nevada filing here). The relief MGM seeks is to have one of these federal courts rule that the Route 91 shooting is "subject to and governed by" the SAFETY Act.

Passed in response to 9/11, the SAFETY Act

(Support Anti-Terrorism by Fostering Effective Technologies) offers a liability shield to companies creating solutions for terrorism. "In the wake of 9/11 there was tens of billions in liability stemming from an act of terror and Congress was very concerned the security industry would run from enacting anti-terrorism services and products," says Locaria, who advises companies seeking SAFETY Act protection. He has not worked with any of the parties to this action, however.

MGM owns the Mandalay Bay where the shooter was perched, as well as the festival grounds, and employed a Department of Homeland Security-certified security company called CSC. MGM's approach must convince the courts of two things.

"First, that the court has jurisdiction to determine that this was an act of terrorism," Locaria says. "The way the statute is constructed provides the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security with [sole] authority to make that decision. Then they will seek a judge's ruling on whether this was an act of terror, which is the easier determination."

Whatever the court does, DHS still has a ruling to make as well. "My understanding is CSC has taken the proscribed approach in petitioning DHS to declare this an act of terrorism," Locaria says. "DHS is considering that petition but hasn't yet made a decision, which is perhaps why MGM has moved to the courts with it."

Three elements are considered in declaring an act of terrorism. If the action is "unlawful," causes harm to a U.S. "person, property or entity" and "uses or attempts to use instrumentalities, weapons or other methods designed or intended to cause mass destruction, injury or other loss to citizens or institutions of the United States."

A court assuming jurisdiction and declaring an act to be ter-

rorism would be a first. "It's a long shot, but with eight judges deciding on this case, it is conceivable they get one or more," Locaria says. "This has never found its way to

court before, so it will be precedent setting no matter the outcome."

Should CSC's petition result in the event being declared terrorism, MGM's liability could still be in question. "It depends what victims allege in their lawsuits against MGM and CSC," Locaria says. "If the theory of liability centers on security services at the festival, MGM is covered because CSC is a DHS-vetted provider. If the theory of liability is focused on security at the hotel being inadequate or something else – different theories can hold different parties liable."

While it can be tempting to seize a negative view of policies that prevent someone who was very clearly harmed from having their day in court, Locaria insists this law is overwhelmingly beneficial. "I can't stress enough the importance of the SAFETY Act from a public policy perspective. It's critical to how we move forward with entertainment events. The Office of the SAFETY Act continually raises the bar and pushes industry to offer better technologies, services, training, background checks and quality control. We are all benefiting from this. While horrific things happen and will continue to, if the SAFETY Act gets undercut and there's a return to an unregulated posture, we all lose."

The specific merits of the Route 91 case aside, the SAFETY Act's liability shield guards against companies resorting to scary if understandable cost-benefit analysis. "Why spend money and invest in security?" Locaria asks rhetorically. "Even if we do, without liability protection a lawsuit is inevitable anyway. Let's save our money for litigation." 




