Sharper: Your Next Creative Session

Among the many ways a radio station connects with its audience is imaging and the creative behind it. Country Aircheck polled some radio pros in both PPM and diary markets, and a man who reads a lot of imaging copy, for thoughts and pointers you can use in your next big writing session.

Clear Channel RPM & WUSY/Chattanooga, TN PD Gator Harrison: Imaging has to do one of two things and it's even better if does both: Connection and reaction. Connect with the listener, what they're going



through, how they live, what they care about ... and connecting the listeners to the brand of your radio station and what it stands for. Hopefully, that connection will breed reaction from your listeners, which should be the heart of your imaging strategy. Imaging should make you feel something. That reaction could be a laugh, a cry, an amen or a change

in thinking. The obvious goal of "connection/reaction" imaging is creating a loyalty to the station. Don't be "a" radio station, be "their" radio station.

One campaign we did was designed to make our artist liners "pop" by painting them as regular folks, and helping listeners connect with them and the US101 brand even more. Some examples are, "Hey y'all, it's Trace Adkins. I've worked on oil rigs. I used to sit in the break room here at this station and tell dirty jokes with Dex. Hell I don't even now how to spell 'badonkadonk.' I am US101." (continued on page 8)

Remembering Chuck Thagard

Promotion vet Chuck Thagard passed last week

at the age of 74 (CAT 7/31), and a number of his associates share their memories of him below.

Republic Nashville's Cliff Blake: Chuck was a light in the music business and a gentleman all the time. He was knowledgeable, erudite and always a proponent of his artists. His

were so endearing. I remember a time were traveling for different labels, but happened to be on the same circuit of stations. We were going between Virginia Beach and the Delmarva peninsula – back when the stations up there were covered by regionals – and he confessed he had a fear of driving over the Chesapeake Bay Bridge. Would I please consent to driving him so he could close his eyes and not watch? He was a gentle person, but so forceful when it came to his artists. I'm so lucky to have him as friend and I miss him already.

WRBT/Harrisburg's Newman: Chuck brought us new music, introduced us to new artists and was always calling to see how he could partner with our station. That was his job and he was great at it. But when Nancy Ryan, my morning show partner, was hit with breast cancer, Chuck was right there. Not only sending his prayers, but also to provide some insight and encouragement from the point of view of a cancer patient, because he was one.

He once told me that chemo was kicking his ass and asked how Nancy was doing. Chuck's doctor had told him there was a woman in her 70s in the next room who was on the same meds, but not showing any signs of having her ass kicked. His point was to tell Nancy that chemo hits everyone differently. That really made Nancy feel good and, when I told her of Chuck's passing, she reminded me of this story. Not only was Chuck a true pro in the music business, he also took the time to share his humanity with people he didn't even work with on a one-on-one basis. And it really made a difference when it was most needed. We are truly sorry for his family and hope that they can take some comfort in knowing that he's not suffering anymore."

Promo vet Ken Van Durand: In 1969, I followed the guy who followed Chuck as Florida local promotion man for Columbia Records. I have always maintained that had I followed Chuck, I would have wound up selling shoes at Thom McCann. He set the standard for promotion then – he continued to set the standard until he passed.

He was the first to send a newsletter to Florida stations – I still have a couple dozen from 1968. He practically invented the road trip, always had a camera and his pictures document nearly 45 years of the record/radio biz



(they would make a great coffee table book). He truly cared about every artist he promoted. It was a calling and he never let anyone down.

In those Florida days, every promotion man wanted to be mentioned in the same breath as Chuck. He set the bar very high before there were bars to be set. He was a true gentleman. He put the man in gentle and the gentle in man. At the end of one of Chuck's favorite movies, *The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance*, the newspaperman says, 'When the legend becomes fact, print the legend.' Chuck was the genuine article – in both fact and legend."

Quarterback's Chris Allums: I'll leave it to other people to tell the stories about Chuck. I know there were a lot, and he told me some, but always in the most casual and humble way. He was the furthest possible from a name-dropper, even though there were so many names he could have dropped. What I respect the most about Chuck from working with him is the calm certainty he always had about the right way to do this business, and that was

Or, "Hey, it's Billy Currington. I'm a Georgia boy, I used to be a personal trainer, and I sing songs about rednecks and drunks! And I am US101." We also included some tongueand-cheek "sing" promos in the audio just so every promo didn't sound the same. Listeners really connected to these because it wasn't the traditional "same ol' thing."

THE RECORD: ZANE WILLIAMS



BE Music's Zane Williams puts an industry spin on the artist interview: I grew up listening to KHAY/Oxnard, CA. It was the first Country station I heard, and I got hooked as a high school junior in the early '90s. I'd listen to their top 20 countdown every Sunday after church and remember Collin Raye's "That Was A River" being one of Zane Williams my favorite songs on the chart.

First time I heard myself on the

radio I was with my wife and her family. My brother-in-law got a text from his buddy saying, "They're playing Zane on [KHYI/Howe, TX]!" We turned it on just in time to hear the last half of the song and just danced around the living room. I'll never forget the time I had won an ASCAP award and was on my way to the ceremony, but forgot the little sign I needed to place on my dash for parking. The security guard wouldn't let me in. I said, "You've got to let me in, I'm getting an award!" A passerby saw us and said, "Yeah, right!" The most interesting road companion was a Chevy 12-passenger van that ran on used vegetable oil that I got out of dumpsters. I was constantly working on it, constantly covered in veggie oil and motor oil and every other kind of automotive fluid. Once my filtration system busted right in my face and covered me head to toe with dirty oil and French fry pieces. If I don't have my earbuds when I travel, I go insane. I use them to listen to audio books, for hands-free calling, and for white noise while sleeping in noisy places. They're

absolutely essential. I can't walk out of a truck stop without grabbing David's Jumbo Sunflower Seeds. They're perfect snack to keep me awake on long drives. It takes so long to crack and eat each one, you actually get hungrier as you eat them.

There's no place like home, but I had to be stuck somewhere I'd be happy in Boone, NC. I love the mountains, the greenery and laid-back pace. I feel more relaxed just thinking about it.

When there's downtime I'm on Spotify listening to artists that I've always heard of, but never actually dug into their music. The most redneck thing I've done recently was cut out dove breasts on my front porch with a pocket-knife while my three-year-old son, Buck, played with the feathers.

Mayflower: For us it's about trying to connect to how the listener thinks and feels about the station. So instead of



aggressively telling listeners about Hank FM and the benefits, we try to look at it as if we were listeners, what would we want to hear? We kind of turn down the hyperbole a lot and make it a little more friendly. For example, when we do listener testimonials, I actually interview them for 20 or 30 minutes. I get them to tell us about their experience, how they

feel about country, and then we write the copy [to go with it] afterwards.

There wasn't any one piece of copy that I think was a game-changer for us. We do little things every day that add up over a period of time to the point where you can look at the aggregate and say, "Okay. It just seems like you guys are fans of country just like the listeners are." Most of our stuff is just simple. We're not the overly intricate station. For example, we do 97-minute music marathons. A sweeper might be, "97-Minute Music Marathons. Yeah. We love this music, too."

WSM-AM/Nashville GM Tom English and PD Joe Limardi:

JL: Copy can only be as good as how it's delivered. You have to have a voiceover guy that knows your station and its purpose. Some of the most poignant imaging that we've run had to do with the great Nashville flood of 2010.

TE: Not only did the *Grand Ole* Opry get flooded, but so did the 650 WSM offices on the Opry Plaza, and our broadcast center inside the flooded Opryland Hotel had to be evacuated. The entire staff moved into the small, then-77-year-old tower building and never missed a beat.

JL: We invited listeners to the tower

building on the one-year anniversary and some of the copy included things like, "It's a day of celebrating the powerful

fact that we are Nashville; always have been and always will be at 650 AM W-S-M." More than the writing, it was the delivery that had the most impact. It was something every single person in our area and fans around the world could relate to.

Voice Talent John Willyard: I've run across and voiced a ton of compelling, fun, quirky, emotional, warm, tongue-twisting liners over the past 22 years in Country radio. My favorites are those that really capture the essence of the Country lifestyle, like this one with a specific geographical reference: "George Washington and Robert E. Lee walked these streets. Now Jason Aldean and Miranda Lambert ROCK these streets."

I personally gravitate towards the silly and the self-deprecating – especially the kind that plays upon the morning show. One example with very little copy was a series. In one I would say, "Swift," followed by a quick Taylor Swift hook, then my saying, "Not so swift" into a clip



of a jock saying something nonsensical or a blooper.

WNOE/New Orleans OM/PD Don Gosselin: The most powerful creative copy is copy you can "see." It happens when the words actually conjure a vision, or an emotion that you can feel. And a lot of that has to do with the talent.




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Bringing John Willyard on board as our imaging voice at WNOE was one of the best decisions we ever made. John is not an announcer, he is a vocal actor. When he reads copy, he makes the words jump off the page.

I spent many years as a production director writing oodles and oodles of copy. The two best pieces of creative copy I ever wrote were (for a seafood restaurant), "Fish so fresh, you'll slap it!" And (for an Ozzy Osbourne concert), "More powerful than a pool of Jack Daniels." Thank you, and goodnight.
