Music Counts, Content Matters

What's the optimal number of songs-per-hour for morning shows who've learned that PPM loves music, but are often told content is king? Country Aircheck took a snapshot of morning music in 14 PPM markets, six with stand-alone Country outlets and eight with two or more competitors.

We counted songs in the 6-9am hours, finding a low of five in one hour for one station and a high of 13 at several other outlets. Four of the six stand-alones averaged double-digit songs in each hour; in three of eight competitive markets, both stations played at least 10 songs per hour. Most stations increased song counts during their 8am hours and cranked up the music machine starting at 9am. (Stations and song counts are listed at the conclusion of this piece. Next week, we'll examine diary markets.)

Morning music intensity was highlighted in Phoenix following Tim & Willy's exit from CBS Radio's KMLE/Phoenix late last month (CAT 7/26). A week after the change, The Camel was noticeably more music intensive – as might be expected with fewer benchmarks and service elements. Anchored by morning show Exec. Producer, Dan Persigehl, KMLE played 13, 12 and 14 songs in the 6am, 7am and 8am hours, respectively. That

number was up from eight, seven and 10 during the show's final week on the station. In contrast to Tim & Willy's single-digit spin average, crosstown KNIX with Ben & Matt in mornings routinely plays at least 10 songs per hour and sometimes as many as 13.


Seattle offers another great comparison. "Great radio is what wins," says Mike Preston, PD of Entercom's KKWF (The Wolf)/Seattle.

"It was amazing," KDBL/Yakima, WA Brand Manager **Eric Lutz** tells **Country Aircheck**. "We get the occasional big Country concert, but nothing like this. I'd say there were 30-35,000 in attendance, and the venue couldn't have been better. Even the artists were talking about how beautiful it was. I didn't run into one person with anything negative to say. And since I was on vacation, I was among the campers. Dierks Bentley even spent some time in the camping area hanging out and talking with fans.

"The Gorge Amphitheatre hosts a big, three-day Dave Matthews Band event and an indie-focused festival called 'Sasquatch, every year, but this was the first time country took over and it was just as big," he says. "From what I'm hearing, two-thirds of next year's acts have already been booked and the plan is to hold it on the same weekend as the Oregon Jamboree."

Musically, Lutz was especially impressed with Rhett. "He's just incredible and the crowd loved him," he says. "He did a song called '1994' that brought the place alive. Rhett wrote it, but Jason Aldean has recorded it for his new album. They've definitely got a hit on their hands. Blake flew in for his set on Sunday after taping The Voice, and Miranda had secretly hung around and surprised everyone by coming out to join him on 'Hillbilly Bone,'" he says. "It was a great way to close out the weekend."

The station's Fitz In the Morning averaged between seven and eight songs per hour, as crosstown competitor KMPS' Johnson & Johnson morning team played 10 each in the 6am-7am hours and 13 at 8am.

In June, KKWF ranked No. 5, KMPS came in at 14 6+. Preston says the gap is even wider among adults 25-54, where The Wolf ranks fifth and KMPS is 18th. In spite of that, he doesn't discount the importance of a music presence, even with a strong personality.

"The great part about Country is that our music is so much more potent to our audience than pop music is to theirs," he explains. "Our music belongs to us for the most part, and it doesn't become ubiquitous across 14 stations in a market. That's why you don't see morning shows in Country playing only 2-3 songs an hour, because the music is so strong."

Preston says there's no hard and fast rule imposed on Fitz in terms of the number of songs he must play each hour. "We don't talk about minimums, there's a range we shoot for," he says. "Obviously there's

a preference about what range we want to stay in."

That's similar to WYCD/Detroit PD Tim Roberts' approach to the station's Dr. Don Morning Show, currently tied for No. 1 (6+) in The Motor City. Like clockwork, Dr. Don plays 10 songs an hour from 6am-9am. "I've never really said how many to play, but our style allows him to play that many songs and still have content on the show," says Roberts. "I've never believed you could be a jukebox and win.'

While certainly not jukeboxes, both **WKKT**

and WSOC/Charlotte pack a lot of music into personality driven morning shows. Both the Paul Schadt and Meg Butterly and Tanner In The Morning shows, respectively, play 11 songs each hour.

Less than 100 miles away, another fiercely contested battle is being waged in Greensboro. WPAW's Wake Up With The Wolf show, hosted by Chuck Marsh and Leanne Petty, plays a nearly identical song count to WQTR's Tige & Daniel - somewhere between eight and 10 per hour. We checked 'TQR's hourly song count a month prior to Tige & Daniel's March arrival and found the station sometimes played 13 or 14 songs during the 7am hour.

In a May interview, WTQR PD Bruce Logan noted that mornings had improved from 13th to seventh between August and May among adults 25-54, crediting Tige & Daniel for much of the increase. –RJ Curtis

Due West's Tim Gates, Brad Hull and Matt Lopez put an industry spin on the artist interview: Which stations did you grow up listening to? BH: KNIX/ Phoenix. TG: KSOP/Salt Lake City. ML: KROE/Sheridan, WY. Do you remember the first time you heard yourselves

on the radio? BH: We were driving in Tampa, FL about three years ago when we heard "I Get That All The Time." ML: Have you ever seen That Thing You Do when they're running down the street freaking out over hearing themselves on the radio for the first time? It was exactly like that moment.

What's your go-to food stop? All: Subway. Which regional is the most interesting driver?

ML: Joe Carroll. He's got a Blackberry and two iPhones. He was checking them all when we were out with him in the winter and it was snowing really hard. I was trying desperately to convince him to let me drive. But he insisted that he remain behind the wheel. BH: The thing about Joe is that he doesn't know how to work any of his phones.

Which station will you never forget? ML: One time we visited a bunch of secondary markets and we visited a station that was in a trailer. And, no joke, there was a goat in the trailer. Maybe the goat was a pet, or maybe it was an on-air prize? I think the station was at someone's farmhouse. TG: It was one of our first experiences at radio. BH: It was a great way to get our feet wet. We learned fast to expect anything when visiting a station.


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RADIO AIRPLAY NATIONWIDE IMPACT: 9/10/12





Spring 2012 Diary Scoreboard

Here's a recap of subscribing stations from week three of **Arbitron** Spring '12 diary ratings, released July 31-Aug. 6. Among the standout performers are Clear Channel's **WLLR/Quad Cities, IA-IL**, which improved 15.8-18.4; Midwest Communications' **WNCY/Appleton, WI**, jumping 12.7-13.2 and Emmis' **WTHI/Terre Haute, IN**, which posted the largest share of any Country station in America so far this year by climbing 26.3-27.9, its best book in at least eight years. Legend: A "+" indicates a Classic Country outlet; a "^" designates Country stations in the same rated market owned by a single operator; and a "t" indicates a tie. A "na" means a subscriber-only market, where actual rankings are not available.




