

#### **Dickey Details Dial Global Deals**

An investor conference call this morning (9/3) with **Cumulus** CEO Lew Dickey shed more light on the company's acquisition of Dial Global. Highlights include his evaluation of the multiples



paid, what kind of cost-cutting he expects and competing with Premiere. But first, a breakdown of the deal that is sending dozens of stations to **Townsquare**, swallowing Peak Broadcasting whole and delivering Dial Global to Cumulus (Breaking News 8/30).

Cumulus received \$238 million to apply toward the \$260 million Dial Global acquisitions, as well as the former Peak/Fresno cluster (including KSKS). Townsquare added

71 stations in 15 markets (53 in 12 from Cumulus) to become the third-largest owner of radio stations in the nation with 312 across 66 markets. Townsquare's Country total goes from 51 to 64, while Cumulus goes from 81 to 69. By comparison, Clear Channel owns 120. According to BIA, the Country stations Townsquare is picking up represent about \$24 million in yearly revenue, and have a weekly cume of 381,900. The cume number is representative of all but five of the stations, as those five are in non-rated markets.

The key to all this for Cumulus, of course, was Dial Global, and acquiring that company in a way that was "capital neutral, deleveraging and aligned our strategy of growing our content business and focusing our broadcast distribution in the top 100 markets," according to Dickey

Opening his remarks, he summarized, "We believe the network industry is an attractive vehicle for long term growth, and that scale is essential for Cumulus to continue to facilitate growth to make the proper investments. (continued on page 3)



Kenny opened his gates to instrumentalists and beat-makers worldwide for Electro Shine. 



"We've been investing in network content in our initiatives in Nash, CBS Sports as well as our Right Now Traffic business and some other entertainment content. The investments are now





becoming significant growth drivers for our company. So this transaction represents a capital neutral way for us to accelerate our investment in growth through the sale of some non-core small market stations to generate the cash to purchase Dial Global." Of particular note:

• The Multiple: With Dial Global bringing in \$66 million in earnings (EBITDA) for \$260 million and the station sales bringing in \$238 million and giving up \$33 million in earnings, Dickey pointed to "implied purchase multiple of 3.9 times verses 7.3 times we're selling the assets for."



• Feeling Fresno: The Fresno acquisition, in market No. 68, "fits within our stated goal of positioning our company in the top 100 DMAs," Dickey said. "In essence we're swapping \$9.5 million of revenue with \$4 million of broadcast cash flow, which is Poughkeepsie (market 163) and Dubuque (non-rated) for Fresno (market 68) and revenue of \$14 million with \$4 million in cash flow. Fresno is performing below the average margin of a Cumulus radio station, so there's some potential upside there as well."



• Cost Cuts: Dickey estimates \$40 million of cost synergies and "substantial incremental revenue growth opportunities." He noted that Cumulus identified \$50 million in cost synergies with March 2011 Citadel merger, but achieved \$65 million.

"The way to keep it in perspective: Citadel was, in essence, 56 independent business units. This is really one business unit that we're buying and it essentially replicates the structure of our network. We're looking at eliminating 10% of the combined expenses between the two businesses."

- Advertisers: "The network marketplace is over \$1.5 billion and we've been taking network vehicles to the marketplace that aren't strong enough, meaning impressions, to compete against the market leaders. So if you have two companies that are taking weak groups of impressions, that aren't able to challenge the entrenched incumbents, now we're in a much different positions. We'll be able to combine some efforts to create some critical mass and now go compete effectively for share of advertising dollars."
- Small Markets: "There are opportunities [with] existing Dial relationships in smaller markets to take a lot of investments Cumulus has been making in our platform, systems, training and

• An important piece of music you just don't get: Buck Owens' All-Time Greatest Hits.





Columbia's **Leah Turner** puts an industry spin on the artist interview: **I grew up listening to** KPLM/Palm Springs. I get to start the West Coast leg of my radio tour with them, which is amazing! I feel blessed.

First time I heard myself on the radio I was on the way to play WYCD/Detroit's Beach Bash before the Kenny Chesney show when "Take The Keys" came on. I immediately started

screaming. I called my parents to tell them, only to then tell them I had to go. I couldn't talk because I was missing out on hearing myself on the radio.

I'll never forget meeting with Sony VP/A&R Jim Catino. He told me he wanted to sign me to a record contract during our first meeting.

My most interesting road companion is my bulldog, Diesel. We drove cross-country together. I would look in the rear view mirror expecting him to be sticking his head out the window, but instead he'd be sleeping with his head propped against the cooler.

**If I don't have a perfect pair of boots** when I travel, I go insane. An outfit is just not complete without them.

I can't walk out of a truck stop without grabbing Funyuns. I looked through SkyMall once to see if they had a portable juicer to take with me on radio tours, but I came up short.

There's no place like home, but I had to be stuck somewhere I'd like to revisit Tahiti. I went there as a child and have such beautiful memories of it.

When there's downtime I use this app called My Habit. It has amazing deals on everything ... clothing, make-up, shoes, pet items, etc. I've found some amazing designer stuff on there for like 80% off.

understand the challenges these broadcasters face. We will be in a position to [offer] enterprise solutions to help broadcasters improve their bottom lines and run with more competitive margins."

- Room For Growth: "[Cumulus does] very little business with Dial Global today, so there is an excellent opportunity for us to distribute more Dial Global content across our O&O platform. We talked about incremental growth opportunities for revenue, and that's certainly one of them."
- **Sports Notes:** "The NFL contract, obviously that was a key asset in this transaction, is good for several more years towards the end of the decade. And the NCAA contract runs into the next decade. Those are two key content assets that were very important to us."
- Competition With Premiere: "In the entertainment, talk and information verticals, and largely services, Premiere has really had a clear No. 1 slot without any real strong competition. Now there's going to be good, viable competition."
- Closing The Deals: "With regulatory approval from the FCC for the Townsquare purchase, we expected simultaneous closings on these transactions by the end of the year. We looking toward November to close these deals." And later: "There's nothing controversial about any of this. We expect those to close in as soon as 60 days."






